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- 1Q.Please discuss, in Mr. Brockman's view, whether functionalizing generation leads to2transmission and then classifying then using the same ratios as the associated3generation would be expected to yield similar COS results as functionalizing them as4generation. Why or why not?5
- A. Hydro indicates there is a difference of approximately \$600,000 in revenue requirement
 allocated to the Newfoundland Power and the Island Industrial Customers, depending on
 whether the LIL and LTA are functionalized as generation and classified as 100%
 demand, or functionalized as transmission and classified as 100% demand. The
 difference is attributed to "the impact of the Newfoundland Power generation credit in
 the cost allocation process."¹
- In light of that comparison and Hydro's explanation for the difference, it would be reasonable to expect a difference in the revenue allocation to those classes between functionalization of generator leads as generation and functionalization as transmission, even if the cost of generator leads were classified based on the load factor method or the equivalent peaker method, with the cost being classified as something less than 100% demand-related.
