Under the Muskrat Falls Power Purchase Agreement, Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro ("Hydro") is not required to pay either an increase or a decrease in purchase power charges as a result of an increase or decrease in customer load requirements. As a result, Hydro's internal marginal energy costs for the years 2021–2019 are zero if market opportunity is not considered. Given Hydro's internal marginal energy costs are effectively zero under the Muskrat Falls Power Purchase Agreement and changes in customer load requirements impact the amount of energy available for exports, Hydro considered it reasonable to use market value in determining the marginal generation energy cost.
