Brattle recommends that there be a review of Hydro's assets which provide interconnection with the transmission system to determine if any need to be refunctionalized. Explain in detail whether (i) Hydro and (ii) CA Energy agree with this recommendation.

## (i) Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's Response:

Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro ("Hydro") does not agree with this recommendation of The Brattle Group. Hydro's functionalization of assets which provide interconnection to the transmission system reflects the Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities' (the "Board") Cost of Service Methodology recommendations. However, if the Board changes the functionalization requirements for interconnection assets, Hydro will revise the asset functionalizations as necessary.

## (ii) Christensen Associates Energy Consulting's Response:

CA Energy Consulting does not agree with Brattle's recommendation that Hydro be required to conduct a general review of its approach to functionalizing interconnection assets unless the PUB agrees with the Brattle recommendations regarding the functionalization of Hydro's general leads. If forced to classify these as transmission, according to criteria suggested by Brattle, then a general review of interconnection assets for the purpose of establishing uniform functionalization methodology might be appropriate.
