3 currently without pole storage ramps?

7 A. Hydro has implemented an Environmental Standard Operating Procedure for
8 “Treated Wood Storage”, ENV-SOP-26 - 2002 (Please see CA-NLH-017, Attachment
9 1) to minimize potential environmental harm; however, these controls do not
10 prevent toxins from leaching into the ground. Construction of any new pole storage
11 ramps, with the most current detailed in the proposal, will meet the federal
12 guidelines for storage of treated wood products and will prevent toxins from
leaching into the ground.
