1 Q. Reference: Island Industrial Non-Firm Proposal, non-firm capacity limits.

Will the individual non-firm limits (MW) from the respective Island industrial contracts still be in place if the Non-Firm Proposal is approved? Why or why not? If the individual non-firm limits are not intended to stay in place, how and when would the non-firm limits be changed? If individual non-firm limits are intended to stay in place, please indicate the principles relied upon by Hydro to continue to impose non-firm limits in light of the change to market pricing and the principles applied to establishing capacity limits in Labrador.

- A. Individual non-firm (interruptible) limits for Island Industrial Customers ("IIC") will remain in place as per customer's power service agreements.
 - Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro doesn't have an objection to working with IIC regarding revisions to non-firm limits in their service agreements. Non-firm studies for IIC would need to consider the *Reliability and Resource Adequacy Study Review* proceeding and wind integration studies currently in process.
