Hydro does this 9 because by proposing programs individually, the Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities and 10 other interested parties can judge each program individually. In addition, Hydro presents its 11 capital budget application by asset category and, as such, presenting these programs in the same manner allows for a more fulsome view of proposed and planned expenditures within an 12 13 appropriate asset class. 14 In addition, the considerations and specifications regarding procurement for tools and 15 equipment vary to a greater degree between the noted areas of Hydro operations in 16 comparison to that of office equipment. Generally, office equipment needs and options are 17 similar across all sectors and levels of business and can be reliably grouped into a single project. 18 Tools and equipment for each noted business area (Transmission and Rural Operations, 19 Generation, and Telecontrol) can vary significantly, thus requiring a specific knowledge base and 20 expertise to procure them. 21 Lastly, the proposal and approval of individual programs for purchasing tools and equipment by 22 asset class provide practical benefits during execution, as it allows for accounting, management, 23 and execution of the individual programs within the appropriate business units and 24 departments within Hydro.
