Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's ("Hydro") application for its Electrification, Conservation and Demand Management Plan 2021–2025, stated the following:1 12 13 As the long-term benefits associated with electrification on the Labrador 14 Interconnected System have not yet been fully evaluated, Hydro will contribute 15 the funds necessary for two chargers in Labrador. The capital funds Hydro expends on the Labrador charging infrastructure will not be recovered from 16 17 customers through the ECDM Deferral Account. If future evaluation determines 18 that costs associated with supporting electrification in Labrador are beneficial to 19 customers through the provision of least cost reliable service over the long-20 term, Hydro would then apply to the Board for approval of recovery of future 21 costs to support electrification. 22 Further to this, Hydro is not seeking to recover any of the capital costs associated with the 23 three<sup>2</sup> charging sites in Labrador; therefore, there will be no impact on customers. Government 24 funding for this project cannot exceed \$55,000 per site and is therefore not impacted by any 25 change in budget. Hydro cannot speculate as to how a private sector proponent may have 26 financed a similar project.
