- Q. (Schedule B, clause 10 (d)) How does the \$16 charge for bad checks compare to practice elsewhere in Canada? The clause indicates the charge "may" be applied. How does NP decide when the charge will be applied to the customer's bill?
- 5 A. Table 1 provides a comparison of Canadian utility fees for bad checks as of August 2018.

Newfoundland Power's fee of \$16.00 is one of the lowest fees charged by Canadian utilities for bad checks. Of 10 surveyed utilities, only 2 utilities charge a lower fee for bad checks than that of Newfoundland Power. The fee for both of these utilities is \$15.00.

Newfoundland Power generally applies the \$16.00 fee to all payments returned for non-

sufficient funds. However, the Company will waive the fee under extenuating circumstances, such as a payment returned due to a banking error.
