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For example, the strategy was updated in 2020 to defer the rebuilding of 2 transmission lines: (i) 95L serving customers on the southern Avalon Peninsula; and (ii) 105L serving customers in Central Newfoundland. The updated strategy is provided in the 2021 Capital Budget Application, Volume 2, report 3.1 2021 Transmission Line Rebuild.

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A total of 24 transmission lines have been rebuilt under the strategy since 2006. By the end of 2020, 76% of the rebuild strategy will have been executed.²

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Newfoundland Power's approach to rebuilding its transmission lines through the Transmission Line Rebuild Strategy continues to be consistent with the least-cost delivery of reliable service to customers.
