Q. (Reference Application Schedule B, page 24 of 98) Please explain why Transmission Line Maintenance costs are included in the capital budget.

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A. The Transmission Line Maintenance component of the *Transmission Line Maintenance* and 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Relocations project involves replacing transmission line poles, crossarms, conductors, insulators and hardware on the over 2,000 kilometres of Newfoundland Power's transmission lines.<sup>1</sup> Each of these components is considered a unit of property for a transmission line. As these components will provide benefits to customers for a period greater than one year, they are considered to be capital assets in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

In prior Capital Budget Applications the type of capital expenditures included in the 2021 Transmission Line Maintenance and 3rd Party Relocations project were included in the Transmission Line Rebuild project. To improve transparency around transmission line rebuild projects associated with the Transmission Line Rebuild Strategy, for the 2021 Capital Budget Application, the Company separated these capital expenditures into 2 separate projects.
