- Q. Please provide a summary of the expected cost of maintenance and upgrades during
 the first 10 years of operation of the new CSS and provide the basis for the estimate.
 Please provide a comparison of these costs to the expected costs of continuing
 operation of the existing CSS.
- A. Sustaining costs of the new CSS fall under two categories: Annual Maintenance and
 Support and Software Upgrades. Both are comprised of third-party consultant, hardware,
 and internal labour costs. Recurring annual maintenance and support costs are estimated
 at \$1.3 million per year. These costs are based on estimates to cover software licensing
 fees, vendor support, hardware maintenance, and internal labour.
- To maintain vendor software support and implement major software functionality
 enhancements, vendors mandate software upgrades every 3-4 years. A minor upgrade in
 year four is estimated at \$2.1 million with a larger upgrade/hardware refresh in year eight
 estimated at \$4.0 million. These costs are based on estimates of vendor support, hardware
 maintenance, and internal labour.
- 18 These costs would be subject to inflationary increases over the 10 year period.19
- A comparison of the new CSS sustaining costs to the expected cost of continuing
 operation of the existing CSS was not included in the scope of work.
