- Q. Was a 10% contingency included in the \$31.6 million cost estimate, and is this size contingency common practice in the industry? Why is a contingency needed given EY's extensive experience in CSS replacement projects?
- Yes, a 10% contingency was included in the \$31.6 million cost estimate, excluding
 Procurement and Allowance for Funds Used During Construction (AFUDC) related
 costs. This size contingency is common practice in the industry. Contingency is
 customary in replacement projects due to their size, complexity, and duration to cover
 events not specifically accounted for and compensate for the inherent uncertainty in
 cost/time estimates.
