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- Q. Was the possible electrification at MUN or other government buildings, as discussed during the Rate Mitigation Review, considered during the consultations with the Provincial Government? If so, is there anything factored into the 2021-2025 Plan for the impact of this electrification? If not, why has this not been considered in the 2021-2025 Plan?
- A. The Custom Electrification Program outlined in the Electrification, Conservation and Demand Management Plan: 2021-2025 (the "2021 Plan") will offer incentives for commercial customers to replace fossil-fuelled technologies with efficient electric technologies. This program will be available to support fuel switching in government buildings, including MUN, and was discussed during consultations with the Provincial Government as part of developing the 2021 Plan.

Participation in the *Custom Electrification Program* is forecast to result in 5.9 GWh of additional electricity usage from 2021 through 2025. This forecast is based on delivery of the complete program and does not assume the electrification of specific buildings, such as MUN or other government buildings. Ultimately, which buildings will be eligible for incentives under the *Customer Electrification Program* will be determined based on whether proposed projects are cost-effective for the customer and the utility.
