Q. (Reference CA-NP-125) Noting that the actual project cost was 65% over budget, why did the issues with the DND not constitute a significant change in the project prompting a reassessment and refiling of the project with the Board?

A.

The *Transmission Line Extension – 35L* project (the "Project") was a component of the *St. John's North – Portugal Cove System Planning Study* (the "Study"), filed in Newfoundland Power's *2021 Capital Budget Application*.

The Study identified the least-cost alternative to address the overload conditions in the Study area. The Project involved the extension of two new transmission lines to connect a new substation located near the St. John's International Airport. As stated in the response to Request for Information CA-NP-125, the route adjustment for the Project was the only feasible option to connect the new substation to the 66 kV transmission system and the additional costs associated with the revised route did not impact the determination of the least-cost alterative. As the Project was approved as part of the 2021 Capital Budget Application it was subject to the 2007 Capital Budget Guidelines. These guidelines had no requirement for Newfoundland Power to seek reapproval of a single-year project due to an expected variance. The variances experienced on the project were reported in the following Capital Expenditure Report pursuant to the 2007 Capital Budget Guidelines.
