- Q. (Reference Application, para. 2)
 - a) Is NP requesting Board approval of capital expenditures totaling \$184,209,000 in the 2025 Capital Budget Application including \$164,498,000 in new expenditures (includes \$55,961,000 which would be expended in 2026 and 2027) and \$19,711,000 for projects that were previously approved by the Board?
 - b) Please provide a comparison of the expenditures in part a) relating to the 2025 CBA to comparable figures in the 2024 CBA, both proposed and approved, and show the increase in both dollars and percent.
 - c) Please identify any other capital expenditures in 2025 that are not included in these figures such as expenditures for which NP anticipates seeking approval through supplemental capital budget applications.
 - d) NP indicates (Application, para. 3) that in 2025 it intends to demand \$2.5 million in contributions in aid of construction from its customers. Does this mean that of the \$184,209,000 expenditure proposed in the 2025 CBA, the amount of \$181,709,000 (i.e., \$184,209,000 \$2,500,000) will be added to rate base and that \$2,500,000 will not be added to rate base?
 - e) The \$297,000 for 2026 identified in para. 2(d) is not mentioned in para. 9. Please clarify.

 - b) Table 1 provides a comparison of the expenditure types proposed in the *2024 Capital Budget Application* and the *2025 Capital Budget Application*.

 Newfoundland Power files supplemental capital expenditure applications to address necessary capital expenditures that were not included in its annual capital budget applications. Such capital expenditure applications could be required for various

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reasons, including to address unanticipated equipment failures or to connect new customers to the electricity system.

Newfoundland Power cannot confirm that additional supplemental capital expenditures will be required in the 2024 or 2025 capital budget years. If the need for supplemental capital expenditures does arise during that period, the Company will file a supplemental capital expenditure application in accordance with the Board's Provisional Guidelines.

- d) Contributions in aid of construction are reductions against Newfoundland Power's net plant investment when calculating rate base.¹ As such, actual contributions received in 2025 will reduce the Company's total rate base in that year.²
- e) Paragraph 2 is a summary of the entire proposed budget, which includes proposed multi-year projects and ongoing multi-year projects previously approved for both 2026 and 2027. Paragraph 9 is a summary of the capital expenditures to be completed in 2025. Since the amount of \$297,000 is proposed for capital work to be completed in 2026, it is not included in this paragraph.
