Maritime Electric does not serve customers located in Summerside which are served by Summerside Electric.⁴

Nova Scotia Power does not serve customers in the municipalities of Canso, Antigonish, Berwick, Mahone Bay Lunenberg, or Riverport, which are served by their respective municipal electricity utilities.⁵

The other Atlantic Canadian provinces do not have isolated communities similar to those served by Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro.
